## 2017 Recipients

### **Danielle Metcalfe-Chenail**

Grant Awarded: \$3000.00

Travel to Cambridge Bay, Nunavut to conduct research interviews with Elders as part of ongoing research into the Charles Camsell Hospital.

## 2016 Recipients

### **Calvin Bruneau – Research Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$1,010.00

Over the years, Band members have done independent research, mostly online, on behalf of the Papaschase descendants. This funding supports Calvin to compile more Papaschase history from the Glenbow Archives in Calgary, Alberta. This travel grant helps cover the costs of travel and accommodation during his trip to the Glenbow.

### **Helen Kwan Yee Cheung – Research Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$4,000.00

Supports the telling of Edmonton-based stories which will form a critical and integral part of a project on Chinese merchants in Western Canada. The entire project will cover a historical period that spans more than 130 years from 1858 to 1989. The Edmonton story will start from 1890 when the first Chinese arrived to open a laundry shop two years before Edmonton became a town.

### **Catherine C. Cole – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$4,000.00

In July 2016, Catherine will travel to Milan, Italy to participate in the International Council of Museums' 24<sup>th</sup> General Conference and speak at a session that asks questions related to museums, their collections, and their relationships with their landscapes.

### **Christina Hardie – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$954.74

This support offsets travel and accommodation costs accrued through Christina's participation in the Alberta Museums Association (AMA) *Exhibits* course offered as part of the AMA's Certificate in Museum Studies program, taking place in Coleman, Alberta in July 2016.

### **Don Hill – Research Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$1,359.27

Hill will travel to Montréal, Quebec in January 2016 to visit the Société des Arts Technologiques (SAT) and experience their *Satosphere*, "a new instrument for the creation of tangible, inclusive and immersive experiences, placing the audience at the very heart of the audio-visual experience." This visit will inform and inspire work related to the upcoming 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Canada's confederation.

**Tori McNish – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$240.00

In May 2016, Tori will travel to the Museum of Anthropology at the University of British Columbia in order to partake in the course Anthropology 518 – Museum Methods, a required course for UBC's Master of Museum Education program in which McNish is enrolled.

**Danielle Metcalfe-Chenail – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$1,035.86

Supports Danielle's travel to Ottawa to take part in the prestigious Governor General's History Awards from November 26 to 29, 2016, where a project Daneille co-led, Reconciling Edmonton, is receiving an honorable mention in the Community Programming category.

**Denis Perreux – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$671.00

Denis will participate in the 25<sup>th</sup> Symposium of the Centre for Western Franco-Canadian Studies entitled *Local Engagement – Global Engagement: Identities and Francophone minority communities in Canada* as a registered participant and as a presenter to provide local perspective on the history of community and political engagement.

**Reuben Quinn – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$919.00

Supports Reuben's attendance at a unique professional development opportunity, the First Nations' Language Keepers Conference held in Saskatoon, SK in November 2016. Reuben will present on "Connecting Youth to the Sights and Sounds of the Nehiyaw Language" at the conference. The grant will cover travel to and from the event as well as accommodation and meals during the conference.

## 2015 Recipients

**Don Hill – Research Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$563.32

Adding to the work undertaken through Hill's 2014 Travel Grant, Hill returned to the UK to meet with 'locative' media firm Calvium to gain knowledge and experience in locative media to inform and inspire potential applications in Edmonton.

**Leslie Holmes – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$2,760.33

Holmes traveled to Victoria, British Columbia in October 2015 to attend the University of Victoria's week-long course "Exhibit Design and Installation" as a professional development opportunity related to her work with Edmonton heritage and not-for-profit organizations.

**Tori McNish – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$743.75

As part of her current work towards a Master in Museum Education at the University of British Columbia, McNish attended the Historical Thinking Summer Institute in July 2015 at the Museum of Vancouver. The course serves as both credit for her graduate degree and professional development related to her work in Edmonton's heritage sector.

Grant Awarded: \$2462.00

Historian Danielle Metcalfe-Chenail traveled to Ottawa in May and June 2015 to attend the Canadian Historical Association's 2015 Conference and several other educational and professional development opportunities related to Canadian heritage.

## 2014 Recipients

### **Robert Buckle – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$4,000.00

This grant supported Robert Buckle in attending and presenting at the 18<sup>th</sup> ICOMOS Scientific Symposium in Florence, Italy on the theme of “Heritage and Landscape as Human Values”. His presentation was based on findings from the Whyte Space Workshop wherein locals applied the Historic Urban Landscape framework to the Whyte Avenue area and its surroundings.

### **Catherine C. Cole – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$4,000.00

This grant supported Catherine C. Cole in attending the International Committee for the Collections and Activities of Museums of Cities (ICOM CAMOC) annual conference titled “Industrial Heritage, Sustainable Development & the City Museum” in Göteborg, Sweden. The Industrial Heritage theme and educational opportunities align with Catherine’s personal practice in Edmonton, where she is currently working on projects related to Edmonton’s Packingtown and Mill Woods Living Heritage.

### **Don Hill – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$1,260.00

Don Hill will travel to the School of Fine and Performing Arts at the University of Lincoln, where Hill will share his experience making the Edmonton Soundwalks smartphone app with Professor Daniel Meyer-Dinkgräfe, an expert in animating intangible heritage and Britain’s storytellers on new digital platforms. The knowledge gained from this meeting will inform Hill’s next steps in building new relationships with locative media in Edmonton.

### **Poushali Mitra – Educational Travel Grant**

Grant Awarded: \$4,000.00

Poushali Mitra will embark on a three-month educational trip to South Africa, where she will engage with refugee and migrant communities in Africa’s largest refugee reception hub and obtain first-hand knowledge of their challenging lifestyle. She intends to use this experience to design ways to engage newcomers from Africa in heritage and integration projects in Edmonton.
